High Whorling is her long-awaited first book on handspinning. Handspindlessometimes called drop spindleshave two parts,

the shaft and the whorl. The low-whorl spindle was commonly used in English-speaking parts of the world, while the high-whorl spindle was more common in Scandinavia, Eastern Europe, and the Middle East. Gibson-Roberts recommends the high-whorl spindle as the superior of the two, both in speed and ease of use. Clear instructions and line drawings lead the beginning spinner through choosing a spindle and supplementary tools, acquiring fiber, preparing it for spinning, mastering spinning techniques, and finishing the yarn.
