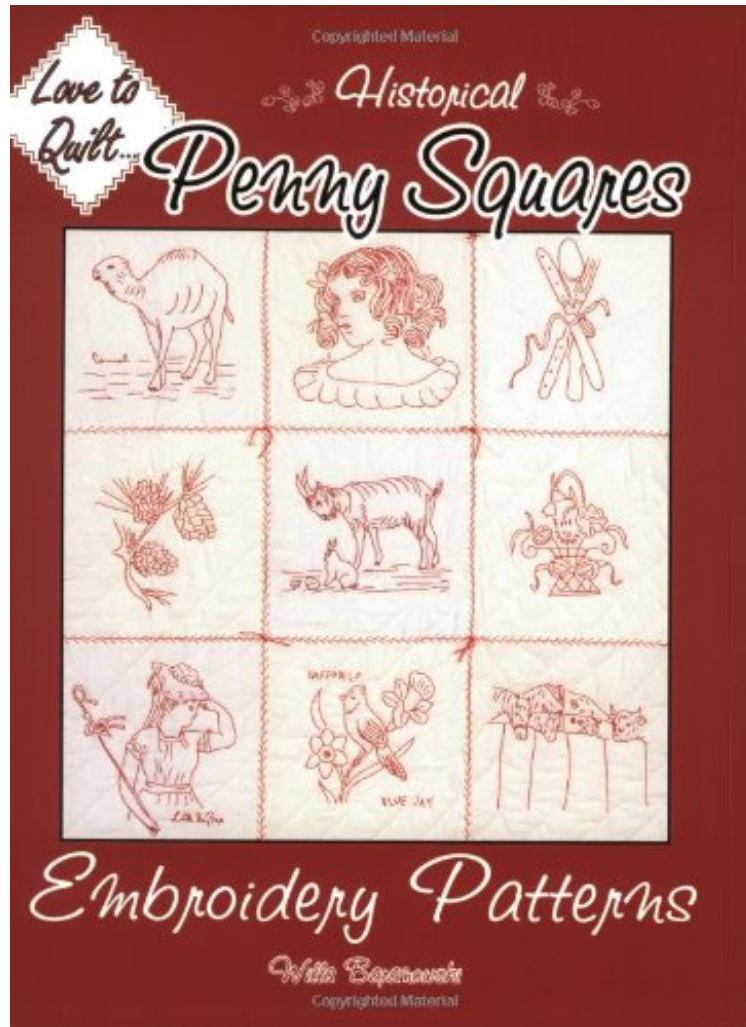

it would be a book of designs that were historically accurate as representative of the time when red work, or single color work, was most popular. I won't go in to a lesson on red work here, it really is a fascinating story, especially if you are interesting in history. While the book has some wonderful period designs, I was disappointed in the limited offerings. I am however very disappointed is the fact that none of the designs featured on the cover of the book are actually offered in the book. In fact, most of the block designs of the quilts shown in the book are not a part of the book. The only positive value of this book is that it does contain some historically accurate designs that can be transferred for embroidering.
